SRC Plate Collection Deadline

In 2009, the USR Board granted the Social Responsibilities Council (SRC) approval to use the Offertory Collection at Sunday services to collect money for social justice causes, as determined by the SRC. In September 2018, the shared plate collection was begun. SRC continues to manage the applications and decisions regarding the applications. **The deadline to submit applications for the next cycle is Wednesday, November 20.** The Council will consider all requests made by members and friends of the USR. The cause should be consistent with the mission of USR to be "a beacon of justice and love in the world." The applications are on the USR website. Using transformative justice theatre, we write and perform our lived experiences, and invite audiences to interact with those of us on stage to look at how white privilege, race, class, gender, and sexual orientation show up similarly or differently in our lives. We create a post-show discussion to work with audiences to understand the racial wealthgap, identify patterns of "divide and conquer" in their lives today, and determine action steps.

"Dismantling the Racism Machine" is inspired by "Dismantling the Racism Machine: A Manual and Toolbox" (Routledge, 2018) by Dr. Karen Gaffney, a professor of English at Raritan Valley Community College.
