Plate Collection application deadline – May 8, 2019

In 2009, the USR Board granted the Social Responsibilities Council (SRC) approval to use the Offertory Collection at Sunday services to collect money for social justice causes, as determined by the SRC. In September 2018 the shared plate collection was begun. SRC continues to manage the applications and decisions regarding the applications. The deadline to submit applications for the next cycle is Wednesday, **May 8**. The Council will consider all requests made by members and friends of the USR. The cause should be consistent with the mission of USR to be "a beacon of justice and love in the world". The applications are on the USR website or available at the SRC table. April Shared Plate Collection

Bergen Volunteer Medical Initiative, BVMI, is celebrating it's 10-year anniversary of providing free primary and preventive health care to low-income working Bergen Co. residents who do not have insurance or the means to pay for care. Volunteer physicians, nurse practitioners, nurses, social workers, dieticians and other professional and support staff provide most of the care to over 1500 individuals in the County. Despite the fact that Bergen County is one of the most prosperous in NJ, 6.9 percent of residents live below the poverty level and over 10 percent do not have health insurance. BVMI fills a critical need in the County and the volume of patients has increased significantly in recent years. Thank you for your generosity!
