Our clients' lives are improved every day through the legal relief they receive, such as Bankruptcy, Criminal Record expungement, debt collection/consumer law assistance, Divorce, Education law, Superstorm Sandy legal issues, Landlord/Tenant issues, and holistic legal supports for survivors of Human Trafficking, families in the South Ward of Newark, and Veterans. It is only through the assistance of VLJ's committed, talented attorney volunteers and its generous community partners that VLJ is able to make the goal of justice for all a reality for the many low-income families in New Jersey with critical, unmet legal needs.


