Plate Collection - March 11, 2018

The plate collection on social justice weekend has traditionally been donated to a group or groups related to the featured speakers. On Sunday **March 11** the collection will be shared by 2 organizations. The first is Black Lives NJ at the request of our Friday speaker, Zellie Imani, the leader of Black Lives Matter Paterson. The money will then be sent to Black Lives Paterson. The second is Ancient Song Doula, founded by our speaker, Chanel Porchia-Albert. She founded Ancient Song Doula I 2008 with the goal to offer quality Doula Services to Women of Color and Low Income Families who otherwise would not be able to afford Doula Care.
