

The question at the heart of the environmental justice movement is ...'who reaps the benefit and who bears the burden of our modern industrial society'.



So what's food got to do with it?

Lots! Food is moved across the country on diesel trucks often through urban neighborhoods where children suffer extreme rates of asthma. Land is stripped of nutrients when cheap growing practices are implemented. Pesticides are used which pose health risks but are consumed by low income people who can't afford food grown otherwise.

These are all Environmental Justice issues. It is poor people, people of color, and billions of animals who bear the burden of our food system.

Nearly 15 percent of global greenhouse gas (GHG) emissions are due to production of meat, dairy and eggs. Livestock is the world's largest human-related land user, taking up 30 percent of the Earth's entire land surface, including 33 percent of the global arable land for animal feed production. The global demand for meat increases the pressure to clear forests and valuable land for raising livestock and growing food, thus contributing to land degradation, deforestation and the accelerated loss of rainforests.

So what's food got to do with it?

Why, the same thing as love does - showing respect for the earth, its living creatures and each other.

GOTV Campaign

The Social Responsibilities Council is committed to a GOTV campaign between now and the election on Tuesday, November 6, 2018. Deadline for voter registration has passed. The SRC table has Applications to Vote by Mail. As we all know, one of the major obligations of citizenship is to vote. You must also be a resident of the county for at least 30 days before the election. You can submit an Application to Vote by Mail Ballot (formerly called Absentee Ballot). It must be received in the County Clerk's office 7 days prior to election . A voter can also apply in person to the County Clerk until 3:00 p.m. the day before election. Click here for the Vote by Mail Ballot application. <u>http://www.bergencountyclerk.org/services/22</u> Legislation was recently passed so that if you voted by mail in recent elections, you will get a ballot in the mail. If you received one, you can opt out, but will be asked to fill out a provisional ballot at your polling place.

The Council will also have sign up lists at the SRC table this Sunday if you need a ride to the polls or if you would like to volunteer to drive people to the polls. Thank You!

Plate Collection application deadline - November 21, 2018

In 2009, the USR Board granted the Social Responsibilities Council (SRC) approval to use the Offertory Collection at Sunday services to collect money for social justice causes, as determined by the SRC. The deadline to submit applications for the next cycle is Wednesday, November 21. The Council will consider all requests made by members and friends of the USR. The cause should be consistent with the mission of USR to be "a beacon of justice and love in the world". The applications are on the USR website.
