October Plate Collection

BLUU (see below) is the recipient of shared October plate collections. Black Lives Unitarian Universalist (BLUU) is a member organization within the Unitarian Universalist Association (UUA) for professional and support employees of the UUA as well as for all Black UU congregants. Founded in 2015 to provide support to one another, and to develop racial justice materials for UU religious educators and resources for Sunday services, the UUA board committed to raise \$5.3M for this work. An anonymous donor committed to IN AMERICA matching every congregational pledge that equals at least \$10 for every member. Last June our Board of Trustees made such a pledge (for \$2,560) which we know we can fulfill with your help by the end of this church year.



Our Racial Justice committee submitted a grant proposal to the USR Endowment Committee last spring and was awarded \$1000 toward our pledge. We now must raise the remaining \$1,560.

The four plate collections in October will be split between the congregation and BLUU to fulfill that pledge. Please be generous. This is needed and important work.

GET OUT THE VOTE

The Social Responsibilities Council is committed to a GOTV campaign between now and the election on Tuesday, **November 6, 2018.** The SRC table will have applications to register to vote and Applications to Vote by Mail at the SRC table all Fall. If you are registered, think about a neighbor or friend who may not be. You can bring them an application .

As we all know, one of the major obligations of citizenship is to vote. You must be 18 years old to vote. You can register when you are 17 years old if you will be 18 on voting day. You must also be a resident of the county for at least 30 days before the election. The deadline to register to vote for the November election is **October 16, 2018.**

You can submit an Application to Vote by Mail Ballot (formerly called Absentee Ballot). It must be received in the County Clerk's office 7 days prior to election. A voter can also apply in person to the county Clerk until 3:00 p.m. the day before election. Click <u>here</u> for the Vote by Mail Ballot application.

Legislation was recently passed so that if you voted by mail in recent elections, you will get a ballot In the mail. If you received one, you can opt out, but will be asked to fill out a provisional ballot at your polling place. Click <u>here</u> to read the article about this new law:


Book Cart/Lending Library Reminder
