SOLITARY CONFINEMENT IS TORTURE Help End it in New Jersey

State Senators Raymond Lesniak and Peter Barnes introduced a bill in the NJ Senate in 2014 to reform the use of solitary confinement (2016 Bill numbers are S51 and A547). The Senate version passed in June 2016. The Assembly version should get into Committee this fall—let's be sure it is passed by the full Assembly quickly! Sponsors of A547 are Pinkin, Sumter, Huttle, Gusciora and Muoio. **You can go to www.raymondlesniak.com/endsolitaryconfinement/to add your support to the passage of this bill.** Significant features of the bill include the prohibition against isolation unless there is reasonable cause to believe that an inmate poses a serious and immediate risk of harm to self or others, and only when all less restrictive interventions are insufficient.
